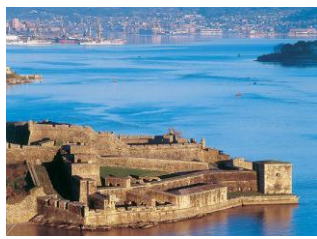

A boat trip along the Ferrol estuary, sailing between the castles of San Felipe and La Palma, complements a wide range of activities, including hiking, landscape photography, and family-friendly adventure sports, all in peaceful, unspoiled surroundings. The experience is further enriched by Galicia's renowned gastronomy: fresh seafood, locally sourced products, and traditional cuisine served in welcoming taverns and restaurants where the flavors of the sea take center stage.

The “El Baluarte” Residence enjoys a prime location in the heart of Ferrol, just steps from the train and bus stations, offering easy access to the city's main attractions and the wider region of Galicia.

Ferrol holds a significant place in Spain's naval history, reflected in its rich military heritage.
